

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

BRIAN JOHNSTON

2017 was a mixed season for the St George Illawarra Dragons where we were represented by teams competing in the NRL Telstra Premiership and NYC Holden Cup as well as Illawarra in the Intrust Super Premiership.

These competitions – including the Harold Matthews, SG Ball and newly-introduced Tarsha Gale Cup – play a vital role in providing valuable opportunities for our players who want to compete for higher honours.

I was honoured to be elected Chairman of the St George Illawarra Dragons in April this year following the resignation of Warren Lockwood.

I would like to take this opportunity to again thank Warren for his services to our club and the game of rugby league. Warren was first appointed Chairman of the St George Illawarra Dragons back in 2001 and spent 17 years representing our club with distinction.

I plan to build upon Warren's contribution to the Dragons and consider it an absolute privilege to represent the club as Chairman.

My role is strategic rather than operational and my vision involves strategies surrounding a sustainable financial model for the club which is indeed a challenging environment with only one NRL club consistently making a profit each year. It is important to do so as it would be very positive to relieve our Leagues Clubs from some of their contributions that they make so that they then can focus on their associated junior leagues and charities, in particular.

I have been actively involved in the NRL Chairman meetings throughout the year, which have been successfully negotiating new funding models and constitutional reforms with the ARLC.

It has been well documented that we have been assessing our governance and ownership structure for some time and it remains a priority. Even though these discussions have been ongoing for some time, it is imperative that any decisions regarding our structures are right.

We are very proud of our club and brand and if there was to be change it

would need to be with right partner and association, to continue the traditions and history of our great club.

On-field success also remains paramount to the overall success of the Dragons. While the ninth-place finish wasn't the desired outcome there were plenty of positive signs that suggested success isn't too far around the corner – the club's positive start to the 2017 season, rising talent and recruitment is a testament to this. This was also reiterated in June, upon coach Paul McGregor re-signing with the club for a further two seasons.

Our Rugby League Performance Committee, of which I am a member, has been a worthy initiative. It has involved independent expertise from outside of rugby league and already we have seen some short-term positive improvements with long-term planning and a holistic approach to rugby league the priority.

As far as on-field milestones go, I'd like to congratulate local junior Jason Nightingale on becoming the third-highest capped St George Illawarra player in the club's history. In the same breath, Jason also became the fourthmost capped player across St George, Illawarra and St George Illawarra and crossed for his 100th NRL try throughout the season.

This year we also introduced two Dragons Ambassadors in New South Wales and Jillaroos duo Kezie Apps and Sam Bremner. I would like to thank the ladies for their contribution to the Dragons and the community in 2017, and congratulate them for their successes at the women's 2017 Rugby League World Cup.

Our Intrust Super Premiership outfit Illawarra faced a challenging season under coach Mathew Head – but did extremely well to play finals football in 2017. The Dragons' recent announcement regarding our 2018 Nuclear Model will see us represented as St George Illawarra in the ISP come 2018 which will only prove beneficial for both current and aspiring first grade players.

The 'Whole of Game' structural changes will also have implications for the Under-20s as they shift to the state-based reintroduction of the Jersey Flegg

competition. The final season of the Holden Cup proved one of the Dragons' biggest highlights in 2017 following their run to the preliminary finals. While they were unable to defeat eventual premiers in the Manly–Waringah Sea Eagles, the efforts coach Wayne Collins and his young squad put in throughout the year were admirable.

As a whole I'd like to thank Paul McGregor as well as his coaching, medical, performance and specialist staff for their contributions throughout the season.

Thank you to St George Junior Rugby Football League President Mitchell Sim and the Board as well as Chris Bannerman and the Illawarra League in association with Kevin Felgate of the CRL. The dedicated volunteers at both junior rugby league districts remain crucial in the rise of our junior players and potential future Dragons.

I would like to say a huge thank you to our longstanding business partners for their contribution and backing in supporting the Red V and helping it continue as the most recognised brand in rugby league. This includes our major sponsors St George Bank, apparel partners ISC, Domus Lighting, Momentum Energy, Wentworth Williams Accountants, Pauls Customs and

CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S REPORT

PETER DOUST

The 2017 Annual Report across all key activities records positive performance, particularly in comparison with 2016. It was a year that delivered improved performance in football and other key business areas in a challenging business environment.

FOOTBALL

Rugby league performance is of course our core activity with the NRL performance our peak priority. While our NRL squad did not participate in finals football, several indicators underlined improvement across the year, particularly compared to 2016.

ATTACK

- Line breaks second in NRL (14th in 2016)
- Tries fifth in NRL (15th in 2016)

DEFENCE

- Missed tackles second best in NRL (ninth in 2016)
- Line breaks conceded second best in NRL (ninth in 2016)

SPECIFIC IMPROVEMENT WITH:

- Match intensity training
- Sprint volumes
- · Acceleration workloads

With our recruitment adding key marquee signings for 2018, the season ahead looks very positive.

Our Rugby League Performance Committee (RLPC) played an important part in assessing and directing our high performance improvement program in 2017. This will continue in 2018 with a

particular reference to the quantitative and qualitative measurement of staff performance and the continued priority for development of the Club's culture and leadership principles and practices. After the 2016 internal review, change was a priority for 2017 and the Head Coach's presentation to the RLPC in October 2017 was well received. It was concluded that coaching management and team dynamics had delivered improvement.

Also in rugby league, 2017 delivered change in the game's structure from 2018 onwards, with major changes arising from the new Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) such as:

- Top squad of 30 players (up from 25)
- Plus six development positions

The NSW Cup is to be elevated to the secondary position under the NRL while the previous National Youth Competition will be reverting to a state-based competition. Thus the pathway has been re-engineered. Given this opportunity, the St George Illawarra brand will be represented in NRL, NSW Cup, Jersey Flegg (Under 20s) going forward.

The Dragons' pathway will support rugby league player development, as depicted in the below chart.

In addition the Dragons have completed a formal Memorandum of Understanding with the Country Rugby League and Group 7 (who administer Country RL from Illawarra to Nowra) to


ensure we continue to work together on "the pathways".

The Dragons are now recognised as a 'Nuclear Model' club by the NRL, NSWRL and CRI

Another key component of our rugby league management activities is recruitment. In 2017, the Director of Rugby League Pathways and Recruitment excelled in re-signing all our young key priorities across the pathway, as well as two marquee recruits. Given the conclusion of negotiations regarding salary caps, through the CBA, the Dragons still have capacity to add key individuals if they meet our criteria.

With respect to our new structure, it is also important to note that in early-December the NRL announced there would be six NRL licences available for a 2018 Women's competition. We have certainly expressed our interest to the NRL in obtaining one of these licences, however the criteria is yet to be determined and communicated from the NRI

Our Club has been instrumental in the development of women's rugby league for many years, particularly in the Illawarra where an open women's competition has been running since 2011. On top of this, Jillaroos duo Kezie Apps and Sam Bremner have been, and will continue to be, outstanding and positive contributors to our Club as Ambassadors.

MEMBERSHIP

Over 19,000 Red V Members joined our program in 2017, a seven per cent increase from the previous year. This is a direct reflection of the work done by our Red V membership team to enhance benefits and improve flexibility for our supporters.

Our Members Advisory Forum continued to evolve in 2017, meeting regularly throughout the year to provide direct feedback on the membership program to Club Management. MERCHANDISE

Merchandise gross revenue in 2017 was down compared to 2016 but the year was still profitable.

This year was the final year of the ISC contract and with any changes in apparel supply, a unique set of circumstances can prove challenging and impacts the Club royalties from the NRL's centralised and controlled licensing program.

This year saw the introduction of a new online shop via Shopify which created an improved online customer experience. This was also enhanced with the introduction of Afterpay while further improvements are planned for 2018.

COMMUNITY

It was another big year for Dragons Community, as depicted in this image. Thanks to Recoveries and Reconstruction for their support of our community program.



PARTNERSHIPS

Partnership revenue incorporating sponsorship and corporate sales activities remained steady in 2017, with organisations across a wide range of industry sectors investing in the Dragons.

In 2017, we welcomed Domus Lighting and Betting Club as new apparel partners with the Dragons. They joined our existing apparel partners in St.George Bank, Momentum Energy, Wentworth Williams, Bingo Industries and Paul's Customs. In addition, we also welcomed several new icon level partners including Brydens Lawyers as our membership partner (see partnerships directory – page 26).

GATE RECEIPTS

Despite some scheduling challenges the Dragons had an average attendance of 13,326 per game across our home games schedule in 2017. Games were played at UOW Jubilee Oval, WIN Stadium, ANZ Stadium and the Sydney Cricket Ground.

A crowd of over 20,000 attended our Round 26 home game against the Bulldogs at ANZ Stadium, while we achieved attendances in excess of 15,000 against the Eels and Manly at WIN Stadium and the Sharks at UOW Jubilee Oval.

'RIGHT GAME, RIGHT VENUE' (RGRV) STRATEGY

Given the uncertainty regarding the redevelopment of the major venues in Sydney and the inability of the NRL to deliver key platforms of our original RGRV strategy over the term, the Board believed we should re-direct our home game strategy for 2018 and 2019 for starters. While initialing such change for the go-forward, it is to be noted that the RGRV strategy delivered significant benefits to the business's bottom line over the period.

CLUB SUSTAINABILITY

The Game (ARLC) and the Clubs have been very concerned about club sustainability for many years. All but two clubs have made profits in any one year over the term of the last broadcast funding cycle. As we enter 2018, the first year of the new broadcast cycle, high priority has been placed on centralised funding to clubs. A new licence agreement will for the first time cover the cost of salary caps. A non-playing football cap is to commence operation in 2018 as well.

The business of rugby league can now focus on sustainable revenue growth through, in particular, improved



scheduling, digital investment, data management, continued membership value propositions and more entertaining, effective cost to customer events.

Comment has been made about the Dragons' debt to the NRL, which was created out of the need to support the RGRV and other key Dragons programs – namely community and pathways initiatives – with working capital.

The first planned repayment of principal was made ahead of time in October 2017 and the debt will continue to be reduced, as planned, over the next three years or less. It is also important to note that the Dragons are not the only NRL club who has chosen to seek funding from the NRL.

St George Leagues Club and the Steelers continued to support the Dragons' business strategy and rugby league generally through 2017 and we thank them for their ongoing support of the Dragons.

GOVERNANCE

Previously, the Board foreshadowed a commitment to ongoing best practice in sporting governance and management. This remains a priority.

In 2017, the Board continued their succession planning and management. Dragons Chairman Warren Lockwood stood down in April and was succeeded by Brian Johnston. We acknowledge and thank Warren for his 16 years of commitment, leadership and stewardship.

In October, Mr. Bob Millward retired as a Dragons' director which has enabled new blood to be introduced as well. Mr. John Brannon has been appointed. John is a company director and Chairman working across government, commercial and not for profit boards in industries including: finance, sports administration, mining, ports, tourism and education. John also has extensive executive management experience in operational and functional roles including General Manager/CEO of Port Kembla Coal Terminal Ltd, government relations, business improvement and cost reduction, corporate affairs, community engagement, health and safety, environment, survey and property and human resources. John holds a Bachelor of Commerce (majoring in Economics), a Master of Business Administration and completed the Australian Institute of Company Directors course in 2012.

Furthermore, discussions with WIN Corporation continued in 2017 although they have not been completed to date. The Board remains committed to identifying an appropriate partner for the long-term future. The process and detail is complex and the fit needs to

be right for our Club. The discussions are ongoing and there is nothing yet in place.

During 2017, the UOW and Dragons extended their Memorandum of Understanding – which was initially formulated in 2009 – until at least 2020.

UNIVERSITY OF WOLLONGONG (UOW)

extended to the Board of Directors for their continued support. To all the staff of the Dragons, thanks for your dedication and professionalism.

I would also like to express my gratitude to our valued corporate partners and Red V Members whose contributions directly support the sustainability of our Club and rugby league endeavours across the board each year. In

ragons 2017 Season Review





NRL COACH'S REPORT

PAUL MCGREGOR

2017 was a season of what could've been for the NRL squad, given how close we came to securing a place in finals football.

While we were able to exceed the critics' expectations set out for us at the beginning of the year, we didn't meet our own.

Our best and our worst performances were too far apart and this was on show in our final game of the season against the Bulldogs – with a top eight berth on the line.

Basically our season shouldn't have come down to winning the final game of the regular season. We had plenty of chances to secure a top eight spot in the five weeks prior and our failure to capitalise was telling.

While I can't stress enough about our disappointment on missing out on finals football, we remain focused on the positives and what we can take from them into the 2018 season. One of those positives was our start to the season – where we sat on top of the NRL competition ladder – following a 6–1 start. This included wins over eventual finalists in the Penrith Panthers, Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles, North Queensland Cowboys and the reigning premiers Cronulla Sharks.

I believe our preparation, patience, perseverance and playing to our strengths, mixed with our strong level of fitness and conditioning, demonstrated that we have the ability to compete with and defeat any team in the competition. Overall, there were strong indications that the systems we have in place are headed in the right direction – a clear sign of this was the significant improvement in our attack considering we went from 15th (in 2016) to fifth this year in terms of tries scored and produced the second-highest amount of line breaks in the competition.

As a football staff, we began our preparations for season 2017 back in November last year. A number of changes and adjustments were made from 2016, particularly following the introduction of the Dragons' Rugby League Performance Committee which highlighted a need of mine to focus entirely on the players and the team performance.

Nathan Pickworth was promoted to Head of Athletic Performance – and brought in a number of new faces from various backgrounds and experiences.

After coaching the NYC team in 2016, Mat Head was promoted to an NRL Transition Coach role which also entailed coaching Illawarra's Intrust Super Premiership team, while former Dragon Wayne Collins joined the club from South Sydney to coach our Holden Cup side.

Ben Creagh, Gabby Ripoll and Matti Clements (wellbeing) and Mick Martin (leadership) fulfilled important key roles in ensuring best practice for optimal performance.

We only used 25 players throughout the entire season, which was a real positive in how the players and staff prepared. While injuries played their usual part, it offered an opportunity for the younger players in our system.

Congratulations to local juniors Matt Dufty, Jai Field, Blake Lawrie and Hame Sele for making their respective first grade debuts. Ranging in age from 19–21, they combined for 31 NRL games and displayed the value of the pathways in place for those coming through the ranks.

A special thanks and acknowledgement also needs to be extended to the other players within our squad that worked tirelessly through the year, but didn't get the opportunity to play first grade.

Plenty of players ticked off many milestones in 2017, but none were more significant than Jason Nightingale crossing for his 100th NRL try. While the 32–28 win over the Newcastle Knights at Jubilee Oval wasn't pretty, Nightingale's hat-trick on the day to bring up his century was something special. Tyson Frizell and Leeson Ah Mau also celebrated two milestones each with both playing their 100th game for the Red V. Tyson also played his 100th NRL game while Leeson celebrated 150 games in first grade.

Congratulations to Tyson Frizell, Josh Dugan, Gareth Widdop, Jason Nightingale, Russell Packer, Siliva Havili, Taane Milne, Joe Lovodua, Leeson Ah Mau, Tim Lafai, Paul Vaughan and Nene Macdonald on achieving their respective international honours in 2017.

Skipper Gareth Widdop deserves special mention for his effort this season, where he was duly rewarded the illustrious Dragons 'Player of the Year' Medal. Despite suffering a knee injury on Anzac Day and missing a month of football, Gareth still managed to finish third overall on the Dally M Medal leaderboard. Gareth was a guiding light for us this year and was our most influential player on game day. To our departing players we would like to thank you for your contribution and wish you all the best on the journey ahead.

I would like to congratulate both our NYC and ISP teams for their respective success in 2017. Mat Head and Wayne Collins did an outstanding job. Mat's Illawarra boys had to overcome plenty of adversity and instability this season and

NYC COACH'S REPORT

The 2017 St George Illawarra Dragons Under-20s side was not only one of the youngest teams in the National Youth Competition but also one of the most successful teams – considering they were in the top four for all but two of the 26 rounds and ended the regular season in third place on the competition ladder.

All 30 players in the squad have reason to feel very proud of their efforts. Watching the team improve from the Charity Shield to the preliminary final loss against Manly – one game from the grand final – was very pleasing and a credit to all the players and staff involved. Although the team lost the preliminary final against eventual premiers Manly, the team showed their never–say die attitude when they came back from 18–6 down at half–time to lock the scores at 18–all. Unfortunately for the Dragons, Manly came home the strongest to win the game.

We started the year with a very young team with 24 of the 30 man squad turning 19 and playing a year young. This means there are exciting times for the Dragons in the years ahead. Two players, Zac Lomax and Steven Marsters, were still young enough to have played

SG Ball while another player, Bailey Dickenson, played five games after he completed the SG Ball season with Illawarra. All three have big futures with the Dragons.

Some of the highlights of the regular season were the close wins where the team was either behind and came home strong or were in front and hung on to win. This is not only a big rap on the players' fight and character, but also an indication of the team's fitness. We have Mitch Nielsen, our strength and conditioner coach, to thank for that. Some of these wins were against the Panthers (Round 1 – 18-16), Parramatta (Round 2 - 26-22), Warriors (Round Ì1 – 24-22), Bulldógs (Round Ì4 -28-26) and the Eels again in Round 15 where we recorded a 32-30 win. Other notable performances included beating traditionally strong NYC teams Parramatta twice and Penrith twice in the regular season before probably our best performance of the year in our qualifying final defeat of Penrith. It was a game where we trailed twice in the match before a late inside ball from Jackson Willis to Zac Lomax (who broke the line) saw Steven Masters score the match-winning try.

As a credit to the club, staff and players, a number of players were rewarded with individual representative honours. Reece Robson played for the Junior Kangaroos who defeated the Junior Kiwis, which included Steven Marsters. Zac Lomax played in a successful NSW Under-18s team against their Queensland counterparts and was also voted the Brad Fittler NSW Under-18s best player. Zac also captained the Australian Schoolboys on their tour of New Zealand. Reuben Garrick and Tristan Sailor played against each other in the Under-20s Origin clash while Tristan was also nominated for the NYC Dally M Player of the Year award.

Jackson Ford was named the Paul McGregor Player of the Year for season 2017 for his consistent performances throughout the season following his dominant displays in carrying the ball an average 113 metres per match. Jackson also finishing third in the team for tackle breaks. Jackson won out over a team full of strong performers.

Our captain, Stuart Mason was also named in the NYC Academic Team of the Year, which was due reward for his efforts both on and off the field. Stuart is

This year we had Matheson Johns, Rueben Garrick, Reece Robson, TJ Uele and Jai Field play both grades which is great for them and the future of the club.

I would like to thank the Illawarra and Group 7 competitions and all the local coaches of our Under–20s squad players for working hand–in–hand with our players' development.

TEAM ACTIVITIES

Some of the activities the team participated in included:

NRL Rookie Camp – 10 players attended and participated in educational sessions on cultural awareness, social media, alcohol, personal brand, respectful relationships, illicit drugs, money manners, mental health awareness, player manager roles, the RLPA and theatre sports.

Playwise Camp – Players spent a few days at TAFE thanks to a Dragons initiative which provides players with sessions on finances, social media,

The Resilience Project – The squad attended a presentation with the NRL and NSW Cup squads from The Resilience Project which uses the power of story to promote gratitude, empathy and mindfulness as effective tools for good health.

Cultural Night — The players and their families told stories of their cultures. Everyone appreciated learning about the many cultures within the team and what playing rugby league meant. Jason Gillard's grandmother sharing her experience as part of the Stolen Generations was particularly memorable.

Anzac game dinner – After taking the team through a gruelling training session, Shaun from the 2nd Commando Regiment told of his experiences in the army and what Anzac Day means to him.

DEVELOPING YOUNG MEN

Away from the field, the playing squad also represented the club at a number of

events throughout the season including the i98FM Convoy for Kids, which is now a tradition for members of the team to assist with in name of raising funds for the local Illawarra charities.

From within the squad we had seven players at University undertaking a degree, another four completing a Certificate III or IV course, five completing an apprenticeship, two completing traineeships, and another three players who completed their HSC.

NSW CUP COACH'S REPORT

MAT HEAD

The 2017 season for the Illawarra RLFC team competing in the Intrust Super Premiership (ISP) involved a number of changes from the National and Premiership-winning 2016 season of the Illawarra Cutters. These changes in both staff and playing personnel, the team managed to finish the season in the top eight and fifth overall. A change in sponsorship arrangements brought about a change in name from the Illawarra Cutters to Illawarra RLFC at the beginning of the 2017 season. Our focus for Illawarra in 2017 was offering opportunities for a number of local players from the Dragons' development regions. This saw the majority of the Illawarra squad comprised of players from local Illawarra and Group 7 clubs as well as players graduating from the Dragons' successful 2016 Holden Cup (Under-20s) team.

In addition to these players, members of the successful 2016 ISP team were afforded an opportunity with the NRL squad in the 2017 season. These players were Chris Lewis, Jacob Hind, Levi Dodd and Shaun Nona and highlighted the benefits of our development pathways.

Throughout the season Illawarra were always within the top eight, though at times lacked consistency. This in part was due to the youthfulness of the team that was selected each week. We used 39 players in 2017 including a number of current Under–20s players who were blooded throughout the year. Regular team members Jai Field, Pat Herbert, Izaac Thompson, Jack Payne, Blake Lawrie, Mathew Dufty, Adam Clune, Luciano Leilua, Josh Kerr, Jacob Host and Hame Sele are all under 22 years of age.

With such an inexperienced team, the experience of the likes of Jake Marketo, Will Mathews and Jacob Hind was crucial. The assistance of these senior players accelerated the learning curve for these young players and will set them up for the future.

The loss of four experienced players in Mose Masoe, Tyrone McCarthy, Lewis and Nona to mid-season transfers also set the team back over a number of weeks.

The foundations that this year set for many of the players with NRL

aspirations will prove beneficial moving forward as these young men have gained experience at this level of rugby league many of their peers are yet to gain. After consistent performances in ISP, Lawrie, Sele, Field and Dufty were all rewarded with their NRL debuts. With all these players being local juniors they are great examples of the pathway through the Dragons' junior representative teams into the Under-20s, ISP and eventually the NRL.

HIGH PERFORMANCE UNIT REPORT

Now in its ninth year, the 2017 St George Illawarra Dragons High Performance Unit (HPU) was made up of 49 players who were selected from our respective St George Dragons and Illawarra Steelers Harold Matthews and SG Ball teams. The major focus of the program as always was to fast track the skills and physical development of our targeted, elite junior players.

The players identified to participate in this program are selected due to their ability and attitude throughout the junior representative season. Beginning in May, the program was divided up into two six week blocks.

The skills program was overseen by the St George and Illawarra SG Ball and Harold Matthews cup coaches Ben Linde, Shane Millard, Pat Gibson and Brendon Perenara. Additional input is also provided from NRL assistant coaches Ben Hornby and Dean Young, who themselves, are products of such programs. Ben and Dean have also undertaken sessions with the coaches to help them improve their skills and

knowledge. A primary focus of the High Performance Unit is to help juniors reach their full potential.

A new addition to the High Performance Unit staff in 2017 was Ryan Bailey. Ruan was employed as the Strength and Conditioning coach of the High Performance Unit, and he oversaw all the elite juniors who had been identified for additional physical development. Ryan works under the guidance of St George Illawarra Head of Athletic Performance Nathan Pickworth who, in conjunction with Ryan, implemented training and testing programs. These programs provide essential data to help transition players through the pathways system. The holistic approach that has been implemented throughout the club by Nathan Pickworth and his NRL staff will benefit the Dragons for many years to come

Another crucial aspect of the High Performance Unit program in 2017 was the work the club was able to do with externally based scholarship players who live in country areas. During the 2017 season the Dragons HPU unit serviced contracted young players from the Forbes, Orange and Leeton areas. These players are identified by St George Illawarra Dragons Country Recruitment Officer Brian Keegan.

As well as the face-to-face visits, Ryan Bailey also communicated strength and conditioning programs to the players via various forms of social media and emails throughout the season. As a result of this external program, five of these players have progressed into our junior representative teams in 2018.

Whilst in these country areas working with our contracted players, we also deliver clinics to identify other prospective talents as well as promote growth and education of rugby league throughout. These clinics were delivered by Young, Bailey, Shaun Timmins and Dan Hunt.

All the work that the Dragons undertake in the country is coordinated by Keegan. Brian's passion for both the Dragons and the development of rugby league throughout a number of regional areas is unrivalled. Brian is a huge asset

for the club and we thank him for his ongoing efforts to coordinate these programs within country areas.

It is a credit to the systems in place and the staff involved that in 2017 we had ten players involved with the New South Wales Blues' Under-16s and Under-18s teams as well as with the Junior Kangaroos. This is a record number of juniors participating in these elite level programs from our club. Five of those players have been elevated to the 2018 Top 30 NRL squad. One of these players who has been elevated to the Top 30 squad was Zac Lomax who was awarded NSW Blues Under-18s Player of the Year.

A number of recent graduates of the High Performance Unit program made their first grade debut in 2017. These players were Matt Dufty, Blake Lawrie, Jai Field and Hame Sele who joined 2016 debutants Jacob Host and Luciano Leilua in the first grade squad. Every single one of these local juniors were graduates of our HPU program in past seasons.

This season's 2017 Under-20s National Youth Competition squad had a higher representation of players from the High Performance Unit program than in any previous season. This team went within one win of qualifying for the grand final. With the majority of the players involved in this team able to once

again compete in this competition in 2018 – albeit in the state-based Jersey Flegg competition – this side should see further players progress through the Dragons' rugby league pathways program.

I would like to thank the board for their

continual support for this program and for sharing our vision to help develop young talented players to reach their full potential in becoming St George Illawarra Dragons NRL players.

Another domestic rugby league season has concluded, but the 15th Rugby League World Cup saw the game continue until early December. Until then we can take a look at the NRL, NSW and Illawarra seasons just concluded and who was recognised for what.

The Bulldogs were flies in the ointment for both the St George Illawarra Dragons NRL side and Illawarra's Intrust Super Premiership team as the 2017 season reached the pointy end. The Bulldogs, out of top eight contention, nevertheless put an end to the Dragons' hopes of progressing into the playoffs with a 26-20 victory in the last game, while the blue-and-whites did the same to Illawarra's hopes of making it back-toback Intrust Super premierships with a 32-14 win in the guarter-final. The Dragons Under-20s Holden Cup team did well to make the final four before losing to Manly. Congratulations to back-rower Jackson Ford who won the Paul McGregor Trophy as Under-20s Player of the Year, as well as Luciano Leilua for winning the Illawarra Player of the Year and Jack Payne for receiving the Illawarra Coach's Award.

I am pleased to see Paul McGregor contracted to coach the Dragons for

the next two seasons and wish him, all players and staff the very best, as well as thanking all of our Illawarra team, on and off the field, for giving their best this season and keeping the flag flying into 2018

It was a big year for Collegians in the 2017 Hardware Man Illawarra Rugby League competition. The Collie Dogs overcame minor premiers Dapto 22–14 to take out the first grade premiership, while also defeating Bosco Engadine 22–16 to win the Under–18s title, and missing the treble by one point in a 17–16 second grade loss to Thirroul. As well, Collies collected the Print Media Club Championship Trophy, and dead-heated with Dapto for the Bob Lowrie Trophy for the most tries scored during the season (80 each).

In other grades, Windang defeated Avondale 20–0 in the Illawarra Shield, Corrimal Cougars defeated Berkeley 24–0 to take the Inspirations Paint women's league title, while Batemans Bay defeated Berkeley 30–20 to win the women's Under–18s. point scorer with 58 points and secondhighest try scorer with 10 four-pointers, as well as being named her club's best and fairest of the season. The women's competitions certainly have resonated along the Illawarra and South Coast this year and I have no doubt they will only go from strength to strength.

In other awards, Helensburgh's Wayne Bremner was named the Paul McGregor Medal Player of the Year as well as taking the Frank Smith Trophy for best back.
